BEST NEW DIRECTOR AWARD PRESENTED TO RUSSELL P. MARLEAU IN SEATTLE

Los Angeles, CA – The Seattle Lesbian and Gay Film Festival jurors awarded the Best New Director trophy Sunday (22) to first-time feature film director Russell P. Marleau for his indie teen comedy "The Curiosity of Chance" for Bigfoot Entertainment. Written by Marleau himself, the film stars Tad Hilgenbrinck ("American Pie Presents: Band Camp"), Brett Chukerman ("Eating Out 2: Sloppy Seconds") and Chris Mulkey ("North Country").
